Acceptance rates reported in the data include short as well as full papers, so are not accurate. Full paper acceptance rate for 2016, based on conference frontmatter is possibly 29% (although the frontmatter is not entirely clear - it would be helpful if this was unambiguous in future). Submissions are low but improving and although h-index is low, citation rates are somewhat better. There is some evidence of support from strong researchers. It is at the lower end of the B range but should stay as B, and there is some evidence it is improving.
