CADE was ranked "A" and applied for a rerank to "A*".

The committee noted a range of factors, both positive and negative. In some years the chairs were quite weak for an A/A* conference (H<20). The acceptance was quite high. The PC looks strong, and is very active. The Google h5=19, and CCF=B. WPP for top people (systematically identified) put CADE 2nd (behind IJCAI) – but unclear how much of this is including IJCAR. Finally, the citation centiles were somewhat weak for an A/A*. Considering the h5 (strongest author on each paper), only ~3% were in the top 25% (compared to A/A* in the area), and ~19% in the top 50%. On the other hand, looking at the citations, ~19% of CADE papers were in the top 25% (relative to other A/A* in this area), and 58% were in the top 50%.

The comparators were not that convincing:

Comparator 1 (IJCAR): chairs stronger, IJCAR acceptance rate slightly lower (but still high), https://link.springer.com/content/pdf/bfm%3A978-3-030-29436-6%2F1.pdf

Comparator 2 (CAV): lower acceptance rate, chairs variable, much higher h5=38 - not on the list to evaluate, but appears plausible for A* despite some anomalies.

Overall, despite some positives, the committee felt that this should retain "A" ranking. It is clearly not A*, and although some indicators would question the "A" ranking" the committee felt that, holistically, it was justified.

Note: Acceptance numbers for 2019 combine all types of papers. Just full papers is 27/53, i.e. just over 50%
